Nokia reveals its latest stab at a return to mobile glory-- the Lumia 920, an upgrade on the Windows Phone-powered flagship smartphone, with a slightly larger display and improved specs.



Revealed at Nokia World 2012, the Lumia 920 fits <u>earlier reports</u> by being the first Nokia handset to carry Windows Phone 8, as well as a 1.5GHz dual-core Snapdragon S4 processor, 4.5-inch 768 x 1280 "PureMotion HD" curved glass display and 2000mAh battery.

Like the earlier Lumia models, the Lumia 920 comes in a sleek one-piece polycarbonate body in a variety of "vibrant colours." Meaning yellow, red, white, grey and black.

Nokia claims the LCD display is not only the "fastest ever shipped on a smartphone" but also "the brightest" yet, with colour tone and brightness automatically reacting to sunlight.

The rear-facing camera also gets an upgrade-- Carl Zeiss optics, PureView technology, an 8.7MP sensor (not 41MP from the PureView 808, unfortunately), "floating lens" technology (optical image stabilisation and improved light capturing), 1080p video recording and a generally improved camera interface.

One interesting addition is wireless charging via built-in Qi standard support and separate charging plate accessory.
